

Call for Papers

The Micro and Macro of Inequality

May 16-17, 2019

University of Warwick, United Kingdom

The Economics Department at the University of Warwick will host a workshop on “**The Micro and Macro of Inequality**” on May 16-17, 2019. The workshop will run from the morning on May 16 until lunch on May 17. There will be a conference dinner on the evening of May 16.

The aim of the workshop is to bring together a group of researchers focusing on different aspects of the two-way relationship between income or wealth inequality and the macroeconomy. We welcome empirical, quantitative and theoretical papers, and contributions on both business cycle and growth topics. Suitable topics include (but are not limited to):

- Determinants of trends in income and wealth inequality over time and space
- Distributional consequences of macroeconomic policies
- Consequences of micro-level heterogeneity for the transmission of macroeconomic shocks

The workshop will be small-scale (up to 10-12 papers will be selected for presentation in a single plenary session), allowing plenty of interaction opportunities among the participants. We aim to have a mix of early stage researchers and more senior scholars.

Keynote: Two keynote talks will be given by **Benjamin Moll (Princeton)** and **Gianluca Violante (Princeton)**.

Submission: The deadline for submission of papers or extended abstracts is **15 February 2019**. We will give preference to submissions of full papers. Papers should be submitted to warwickinequality@gmail.com. The authors will be notified by 1 March 2019.

Funding is available for economy-class travel and accommodation (up to 2 nights, on May 15 and 16) for the selected paper presenters.
